My Son Noaha-Part 1

Noaha was born in Maine as a full term baby; who required a C-Section because he was also 9.1b and 4oz; and his older brother was an emergency C-Section also.

He was rushed to Bangor from Bar Harbor to the child care unit because his sugar level was so low and he was there for 2 weeks before coming home with us.

At the age of two we were told that he was Autistic stage 2, Non-verbal, and that he may never speak normally. We had all kinds of people come into the house to work with him for physical therapist to occupational therapist staff. Then at the age of four he started at special children's friends school which was to help him learn. He was there two years and graduated to regular school, which had special needs program for him. At this time we also got to meet a special woman who became him and his brothers care manager.

During this time is when the head banging began, and he had to have a special helmet made for him. Which meant we had to go to Bangor to measure his head. He refused to do a lot of things at school and his head banging persisted and we had been on several waiting lists that ok a long time to get on the programs that he needed.

When he head bangs, we have to watch out for his head because once he has almost broke my nose. We have been on waiting lists for over 6 years now for extra help both at home and school. He is not doing occupational therapy anymore for refusals, and not working towards his goals. Going to school he has been sent home a lot due to safety of teachers and helpers. Now we are slowly getting into a routine with him about doing things for himself and peers.

So as of now, there is no helmet, but his head banging still continues and he is still being sent home now for bathroom refusals. He will not potty train and so wears pull ups still.

Noaha still has to have special wipes and pull ups because his

skin is so sensitive to certain things.

We have also had problems with him doing what we want him to do and telling us what he wants. Now he goes to the cupboards and refrigerator and points or get what he wants to eat or drink.

He is very active, on the go all the time, and gets into trouble a lot, but we try to take care for his safety and keep him occupied with phones for YouTube and certain cartoons and movies that he likes. When the school sends Noaha home I have to leave work to go and get him and bring him home.

Doctors have put him on certain medications for his aggression and sleep because he does not sleep the eight hours he is supposed to. We have tried a lot of medications but only certain ones will work for him and he continues on the same medications till this day.

Our issues with Noaha are ongoing and we share more of struggles with him in future news-



Not that long ago, adults and children with mental illness or mental disabilities were warehoused in institutions. Their basic needs were met but that was all.


When people realized that quality of life was important. Institutions were closed.

OHI was one company, that took in adults with mental disabilities into homes, to give them a better quality of life.

OHI has been trying to fill basic needs to improve the lives of adults whom most have forgotten about. OHI became aware that people with mental illness needed more support in Hancock County. They helped open Eagles' Nest Clubhouse over four years ago. OHI became aware of a program called "The Clubhouse" that was created 40 years ago in New York City. This Clubhouse was called Fountain House.

This program was created to get people with mental illness out of their homes and to get them to meet others who would understand. The program starts with getting through the door, and enjoying a well rounded homemade lunch.





Jim's Story

Jim is a new member here at Eagle's Nest. He first heard about Clubhouse from his granddaughter who found out about us online. Before becoming a member here Jim was bored at home. He now enjoys coming to clubhouse daily and working side by side with other members. Jim says he would recommend joining a clubhouse because it, "gets you away from home doing nothing and out into the world." His family and friends have also noticed a difference in him he says since he has joined The Eagles' Nest Clubhouse. They say he has not appeared as angry or bored.
